Explanation of Results

The results of the GCSE examination and the GCSE (Short Course) examination are reported on an 8 point scale of Grades A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f), G(g), of which Grade A*(a*) is the highest and Grade G(g) is the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for Grade G(g) receive an **Unclassified** (U(u)) result. Where **Unclassified** is received the result will not be recorded on the certificate.

- No result (X)** indicates that a result is not being issued because of absence from all parts of the examination or because of a decision not to issue a result for any other reason. The subject will not appear on a certificate.
- Pending (Q)** indicates that no result has been issued as the marks for one or more components of the subject are not available. The candidate is advised to contact the examinations officer at the centre for further details.
- #** indicates that the candidate was absent from part of the examination in the subject and was awarded a zero mark for this part. The grade was awarded on the components actually taken.

DOUBLE AWARD SUBJECTS

The results in these subjects are reported on a 15-point scale of Grades A*A*(a*a*), A*A(a*a), AA(aa), AB(ab), BB(bb), BC(bc), CC(cc), CD(cd), DD(dd), DE(de), EE(ee), EF(ef), FF(ff), FG(fg), GG(gg), of which Grade A*A*(a*a*) is the highest and Grade GG(gg) is the lowest. The results in these subjects have the same status as GCSE grades in two other single subject specifications.

GCSE (SHORT COURSE)

The Short Course is designed to cover not less than half the specification content of the corresponding full GCSE Subject course of study and the same grading standards are applied. The GCSE (Short Course) is, therefore, broadly equivalent to half the corresponding full GCSE.
