EXPLANATION OF GCSE RESULTS

Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for Grade G(g) are UNCLASSIFIED, U(u). Where UNCLASSIFIED is received it will not be recorded on the certificate.

NO RESULT 'X' indicates that a result is not being issued because of absence from all parts of the examination or because of a decision not to issue a result for any other reason.

PENDING 'Q' indicates that no result has been issued as the marks for one or more components of the examination are not available. The candidate is advised to contact the examinations officer at the centre for further details.

DOUBLE AWARD SUBJECTS

GCSE (SHORT COURSE)

The Short Course is designed to cover not less than half the specification content of the corresponding full GCSE subject course and the same grading standards are applied. The GCSE (Short Course) is, therefore, broadly equivalent to half the corresponding full GCSE.
